INTRODUCTION TO THE MASS

We wish you a blessed New Year! Yes, indeed: in the eyes of the Christian community we are beginning a new liturgical year. We call it the season of Advent. It is all about the coming of the Son of God into our world in the past, and his coming to mark the end of that world in the future. Both comings mark a new age. Our God says: 'I am making all things new'. At this time, we are all called to renewal: or, better still, we are all called to experience newness of life. So today, we begin a time of waiting.... not just waiting for something to turn up... but waiting for someone to show his face. We await the coming of Jesus a real person who can change our lives. There is a note of high hope about this Advent season.

HEADINGS FOR READINGS

First Reading (Jer 33:14-16). The Lord promises hope to a dispirited nation. The foundation-stones of this renewal are honesty and integrity.

Second Reading (1 Thess 3:12-4:2). As Paul and his community in Thessalonica prepare for the Lord's coming, he urges them to concentrate on the only value that matters, love. In this way they will be living the kind of life God wants them to live.

Gospel (Lk 21:25-28, 34-36). When faced with the fear of uncertainty in relation the end of our lives, there is one sure way to gain confidence: "Stay awake, and pray for strength".

PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

Let us pray today for the strength to make this advent a time of wholehearted preparation for the coming of Jesus into our hearts this Christmas.

RESPONSE: LORD, GRACIOUSLY HEAR US.

- 1. For Christian leaders throughout the world: that they may witness to the values of integrity and justice in all their decisions. Lord, hear us.
- 2. For Christian families: that they may help their children this advent to prepare in a special way for Jesus' birth. Lord, hear us.
- 3. For those who see no meaning in Christmas: that they may derive some support and encouragement from Christian neighbours this advent. Lord, hear us.
- 4. For those who have died: that their time of waiting may give way to a joyful recognition of him whom they have longed to meet. Lord, hear us.
- 5. For our own private intentions. Lord, hear us.

God, our Father, we ask you to look with kindness on these our prayers. Fill our hearts with courage and eager longing, so that when Christmas comes, we will be found watching and waiting, and ready to receive the gift of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

COMMUNION REFLECTION

Christ has given himself to us in this Eucharist. In doing so he gives us both the sign and the promise that he is with us in every situation in our lives. Recalling a joyful moment, we can say "That was a gift, brought to me by Christ". Facing a difficult problem, we can lay it before him in trust, knowing that he is with us also there. This

is the same Christ who will come to meet us at the final moment of death, so let us thank him now for the life which is already ours, and the life to which he will invite us then and let us ask him to be with us always, Come, Lord Jesus.

PRAYER FOR RECEIVING A SPIRITUAL HOLY COMMUNION

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.





HISTORY AND LIVES OF OUR SAINTS



Melchor Chyliński was born on 8 January 1694 in the Crown of the Kingdom of Poland to Jan Chyliński and Marianna Małgorzata; his relations often nicknamed him as "the little monk" due to his pious nature.^[1] He later graduated from the Jesuit-run College in Poznań and decided to enter the armed forces in its cavalry section where he was made an officer three years later.


On 4 April 1715 - despite the objections of his comrades - he joined the Order of Friars Minor Conventual in Kraków and changed his name during the course of his novitiate to "Rafal". He was ordained to the priesthood in December 1717 after having made his perpetual profession on 26 April 1716.

He was assigned to parishes in nine separate cities before being sent to the place that he would spend the remainder of his life in and he distributed food and clothing to the poor and sick people there; he also played the harp and the lute as well as the mandolin for liturgical hymns and spent 20 months in Warsaw ministering to epidemic victims. He was also known for his simple and candid sermons and for being an apt confessor. He died on 2 December 1741.
